#### 12.FREE MEDICAL CAMP - 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2011

Medical camps in various specialties on a regular basis are very popular in the developing countries. In the developed countries, most of the people live in the urban areas and the sick population has no problem in attending city hospitals. Thus medical camps are very rarely conducted there. In the developing and under developed countries like ours majority of the population live in the rural areas. The annual income of our population is also less and because of the difficult terrains and lack of proper transport, sick population cannot visit health institutions for their medical treatment. According to recent survey reports only 20 % of our rural population has access to safe drinking water and health care. To facilitate the rural population around Karunya University the SEESHA Karunya Rural Community Hospital is functioning at Karunya nagar. The National Service Scheme of Karunya in association with the SEESHA Karunya Rural Community Hospital conducted a Free Medical Camp on 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of Jan 2011 at Kulathupalayam in Thondamuthur, a remote village 10 kms away from the University premisies.

#### 13.PARTHENIUM AWARENESS CAMPAIGN – 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2011

Parthenium Hystrophorous, a poisonous plant is found in huge numbers around the karunya nagar and its associated villages. The rapid growth of the Parthenium weed has become a threat to the environment and biodiversity. It adversely affects the germination and growth of several crops. The pollen grains of Parthenium, or congress grass or carrot grass in common parlance, several diseases like eczema, asthma and dermatitis. The weed also causes dermatitis in animals like cows and goats. When they eat the weed, their milk becomes bitter and drinking it for some length of time may cause death. It is observed that cutting or slashing of Parthenium enhances its regeneration. So uprooting manually is the finest option. During the rainy season, the soil remains wet and hence manual or mechanical removal can be done before the onset of flowering with people's participation.

To spread this news, the NSS unit of Karunya University joined hands with the Department of Biotechnology to create awareness for the nearby village people about the plant Parthenium and its effects to human beings. In this context, a rally was conducted on 21-1-11 from the EMS school, Karunya Nagar till saadivayal covering Naloorpathy village from 4.00p.m to 5.00p.m.

Around 60 volunteers, 15 student coordinators and 5 programme officers participated in the rally and the villagers were informed about the issue through pluckcards, Flipcards and banners. The NSS programme officer Dr. S. Kavitha, Assistant Professor, Biotechnology gave a small briefing on the ill effects of this plant to the villagers at the closing meeting conducted at Naloorpathy village.

#### 14.PULSE POLIO CAMPAIGN PHASE - I 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2011

**Pulse Polio** is an immunization campaign established by the government of India in 1994 to eradicate poliomyelitis (polio) in India by vaccinating annually all children under age five against poliovirus. Every child (0-5 years of age) receives a dose of Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV), a live, attenuated virus which colonises the gastrointestinal tract. This virus competitively inhibits the wild, disease-causing poliovirus. Not only does this prevent pernicious infection in the host, it precludes transmission of the wild poliovirus to other hosts. Since poliovirus cannot survive outside a host for more than two weeks, theoretically it would be eradicated, resulting in the eradication of poliomyelitis. The campaign proved to be successful and the incidence of poliomyelitis in India has decreased dramatically.

This year the first phase of the Pulse polio campaign was conducted on 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2011 all over India. On this day around 160 volunteers of NSS unit of Karunya University along with the Primary Health Centre, Alandurai assisted the immunization drive in 27 centres around Karunyanagar.
