AFTERNOON:



The first event planned for the day was the distribution of fliers for the eye camp on Monday. Other teams were deployed to clean the village and ensure a clean environment, through eradication of plastic waste and other bio degradable substances.

27/01/13 DAY 6

FORENOON:

The team started the last day of our camp with a plastic awareness rally for which a group of students were sent into the village. Our students started interacting with the people to

The team started conducting various activities such as mingling themselves with the children to teach them and educate them through games.



28/01/13 DAY 7

Sports competitions were conducted for the primary school children separately for boys and girls for whom prizes were awarded.



Finally special camp in Mathvarayapuram ended and the team returned back with a content heart.

CAMP SITE: ALANDURAI 22/01/13 DAY 1

FORENOON:

The NSS special camp started with a word of prayer in mind and enthusiasm in heart, the teams split up and surveyed all the villagers. Then the team came up with an agenda on what had to be done.

As the cleaning of the field and ground was over the teams turned their attention towards

renovation and cleaning the entire campus.



AFTERNOON:

In response to the schools request, the team engaged itself in decorating the school completely and making it ready for the republic day.

Other teams were deployed to carry out various other activities.



26/01/13 DAY 5

FORENOON:

The republic day celebrations started with flag hoisting and a function involving local delegations and cultural events by students conducted by the volunteers from our team.



AFTERNOON:

As the painting and the cleaning job was not completely over, the team had to continue its work. They worked effortlessly and painted almost half the campus within a short span of time.



27/01/13 DAY 6

FORENOON:

The special camp started with a dengue awareness rally, for which the students shouted slogans and sang songs in Tamil to illustrate the harmful effects of dengue and methods for preventing it.

A guest speaker from the famous NGO Organisation "OSAI" delivered a speech on the ill effects of deforestation, following which a closing ceremony was held to bring an end to the special camp.



CAMPSITE: SEMMEDU

22/01/13 DAY 1

FORENOON:

The camp kicked off from Karunya campus around 9a.m. to meet up with the challenges that would be waiting at Semmedu village. Upon reaching the village, teams were divided and the plan was discussed. A strategy was set up to tackle the issues of the village.



AFTERNOON:

The main work of the afternoon session was to scrap out the worn out paint from the four buildings of the elementary school, as the paint that was already present had worn off due to the climatic changes and was falling off. Thus making the floor dirty, the work was suspended at the end of day.







24/01/13 DAY 3

The team started to finish the scraping work, it was noted that large amounts of construction waste were heaped up behind the school which was the home for many reptiles like lizards and snakes, a big threat to the students. Cleaning work was pepped up in these areas

AFTERNOON:

A temporary schedule was made with respect to the issues that had to be addressed in the following days.



23-1-13 FORENOON:

DAY 2

The objective for the day was to promote cleanliness, eradication of plastics, and to reach out empowering women in the society.

Based on this, a cleaning drive was initiated to sanitise the surrounding and removal of plastics from harming the lovely greenery around. Villagers were advised not to burn plastics. The teams were on their toes creating an awareness of the dangers of plastic and importance of a clean neighbourhood.



AFTERNOON:

The morning session proved fruitful, it was decided to make haste of the situation and a rally was organised to spread the word around on empowering women. The rally was flagged off by HOD DECE Mrs Maya Mahajan. By enthusiastically shouting slogans they captured the hearts of the people and were able to send a strong message through the rally. BEFORE

Meanwhile a team brainstormed ideas for a skit. It was a team performance which included the children of the school. Certain others kept the children engaged by conducting competitions.



Afternoon:

A rally based on Dengue awareness was conducted and a skit was also portrayed based on the theme. Interaction with villagers formed part of the session after the rally. The importance of drinking water and ground water conservation was relayed to the public.



Republic day function was held with a sense of patriotism infused with pomp and pride. The tricolour was hoisted at the school premises.

A lovely feeling of being part of a democratic, country was eminent in the gathering. Flag hoisting was followed by distribution of sweets to share the love and joy to others as well. The whole village seemed to come alive with colours of saffron, green and white.

To further add onto the celebrations, competitions were held for youngsters of the community who came with a determination of going back home as a winner, being part of the 66th republic day celebrations. In spite of the celebrations attracting the most crowds, a group of volunteers silently carried on with their work of painting to wrap up the day with a bright image. The village came alive with colourful rangolis being part of the competition. Gifts were distributed to the winners of various events. All in the entire village had its much awaited burst of happy feelings all around.



27-1-13 DAY 6

FORENOON:

The prime objective to make the village spic and span was pursued to attain lasting benefits for the villagers. With the feeling of pride in working for the community, volunteers set out cleaning the roads and heaps of garbage strewn around.



AFTERNOON:

Interaction with villagers formed the next part of the agenda, teams were sent out to interact with the villagers and encourage them to attend the free eye camp that was to be held the following day. As the day came to a close the teams were satisfied looking back at their service to the community with a day more to go.



28-1-13 DAY 7

FORENOON:

As the last day dawned on the camp, a feeling of sadness swept through the volunteer pack, since after serving, being a part of the village it was time to part.

The days events slowly unfolded, as the teams pepped up to the final cleaning round, followed by performing a dance sequence to entertain the villagers.



AFTERNOON:

Prizes were distributed to Prize winners for the competitions that were held for the entire week. Being the last day, it was decided to sponsor items requested by the head mistress of the school and depart with joy and a sense of satisfaction.

Items such as dustbins, mats and stationary were sponsored for betterment of the school and the children at large.

The departing from the village brought many a tears.





CAMPSITE: KALIMANGALAM

22-1-13 DAY 1

FORENOON:

The camp began after a word of prayer followed by an inauguration ceremony. Planning was done after interacting with the locals and the first activity was carried out. A survey was taken all around the village by means of which we were able to comprehend the living conditions of the people. The students went around the place and took the survey and enjoyed the experience of interacting with the village people.





AFTERNOON:

After lunch the area surrounding the school was inspected and it was found that many thorny bushes and weeds were growing all over the place. Immediately the team divided into groups and started clearing the place in spite of the hot sun. Field work was continued till the end of the day.

AFTERNOON:
